This year we are thrilled to share our keynote was the renowned Dr. Jean Clinton. Dr. Jean Clinton is a Clinical Professor, Department of Psychiatry and Behavioural Neurosciences at McMaster University, division of Child Psychiatry, Ontario Canada. Dr. Clinton was appointed as an education advisor to the Premier of Ontario and the Minister of Education 2014 - 2018. After the keynote address, Dr. Clinton provided 2 breakout sessions: Adolescent Brain Under Construction and Learning, Connection and Brain Science in the Elementary Years. Valuing our parents as 'partners in learning', we also had Dr. Clinton present to SD33 parents and caregivers on Thursday evening. This session, Rising to Resilience: The Power of Connection, highlighted the importance of trusting relationships, consistent boundaries and how the brain works at different ages. All of these sessions offered practical strategies and were grounded in current brain research.

Over 50 breakout sessions offered our staff a wide range of professional development opportunities that reflect the four goal areas of our strategic plan.
