#### 4. INFORMATION ITEMS

- 4.1. (Acting) Chair Report Deirdre
  - Thanks for your patience last meeting while we worked through our tech issues.
  - Back on Zoom tonight, but likely will be moving towards Teams as district is not supporting Zoom for DPAC/PACs in the future. We will continue to update you but expect the April/May Meetings to be on Teams.
  - PACs should know that means they will likely have to move to Teams as well, (or budget for a Zoom license if they choose), so we encourage PACs and individuals to practice and start getting familiar with it.
  - Trustee By-Election both advanced voting days have now passed, however, you still have one more day to make your voice heard! March 1<sup>st</sup>. Details are linked at the bottom of the agenda, and Chilliwack Election and District site, SD33 updates many places to find this information. Voter turnout is traditionally low, even worse in by-elections, and costs the district a lot of money, so please go vote, and encourage others to do so. Information on candidates, and where to vote can be found at www.chilliwack.com/elections
  - As we have previously stated, DPAC has chosen to stay out of the process for this by-election, though we do feel, as an executive, that it is important to highlight that we have been contacted for the opportunity to connect and have meetings with only one of the three running candidates. Candidate Bartel has requested a meeting with us to discuss the needs of parents, guardians, and caregivers in the district, and to understand what qualities we're looking for in a new trustee. While we very much appreciate that they did not want to assume they already knew what 'we' wanted as a stakeholder, DPAC Exec discussed, and again declined.

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- DPAC had previously decided not to engage in the by-election and will not be meeting with any of the candidates. All contact information for Executive is publicly available and equally accessible.
- Sadly, we have accepted the resignation of one of our beloved Executives,
   Vrushali Khot, Member at Large 1 (MAL1). She has been in this role for some
   time and has grown to be an integral part of our team, who greatly helped
   further the work of DPAC, and will be sorely missed. While she is no longer able
   to dedicate the time and energy required for this role, we wish her the best, and
   thank her for everything.
  - DPAC will be looking to temporarily fill this role through to the May AGM! Apply here if you are a Rep/Alt—link: https://forms.office.com/r/jKBGRbbzNm
- Preliminary Boundary Review Meetings have started to take place. Formal
  conversations are set to happen at Rosedale, Cheam, Promontory, Yarrow
  within the next week. Smaller meetings may happen at PACs. CMS, Greendale,
  possibly VMS after Spring Break.
  - These conversations are a good thing, imho, since they are doing all this info gathering ahead of time and involving the public in meaningful engagement and hopefully listening to them, rather than waiting for the fallout later. I will try to attend one if I can with my schedule.
- LETS Workshop is on March 6<sup>th</sup> at 7pm Heather McCain on Zoom and we are hosting. I will put the info in the chat to the FB event, but please share and mark your calendars! This month has zoooomed by, and the 6<sup>th</sup> is THIS coming Thursday! We will have the ability to record, but only for a limited time. The title is: Disability-Neurodivergent Awareness + Crip Community Workshop:
- Cheam has now opened up its Before and After school care program as of Feb 5<sup>th</sup>! That means that Tyson Elem is the only remaining school without B&A big accomplishments from where we were 2-3 years ago. I am told they have applied for grants and are doing all they can with spacing at that site though fingers crossed.
- Attended the Feb 18<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting and spoke in support of our Trustee Liaison's Agenda Item 4.2 - Public Transit Advocacy - You can view the pertinent details at the following timestamps:

    - Carpentry, plumbing, electrical work, automotive, and welding.
  - Students earn certifications (First Aid, Forklift Training, WHMIS).
  - Encourages teamwork, problem-solving, and career exploration.
- Preliminary Boundary Feedback Process Update
  - Meetings held with PACs at: Promontory Heights, École Cheam Elementary, Rosedale Traditional, and Yarrow Community School.
  - Staff consultations completed at multiple schools.
  - Parent meetings scheduled: o Rosedale (Feb 24), Cheam (Mar 3),
     Promontory Heights (Mar 4).
- Substance Use Prevention: Mental Health & Decision-Making Sessions
  - Free virtual sessions for parents/guardians, led by Dr. Hayley Watson.

#### 5.2. Outside Agencies in Schools

- Trying to organize spaces within the district that outside agencies can rent to provide services. This won't be available in every school – it will be specific spaces (like the NLC at CSS) that can be rented through our facilities department.
- Trying to increase the number of spaces available during the instructional day for this rental option but are encountering some challenges, which is slowing down the process.
- Next year, providers will be able to rent spaces in all schools an hour before the
  instructional day begins and directly after the instructional day ends (except for
  gym space which is often booked for sports).
- No other districts are offering this option. Given the struggles while trying to secure spaces, the district understands why.
- Continuing to encourage outside providers to rent spaces in local community options like the Cheam center, the Leisure center, local band halls, and dance studios.
- It is recognized that not all families were able to find workable options; as a
  result, schools now know that the new Administrative Procedure will roll out for
  September 2025. Meaning services that were previously arranged can
  continue.
- Parent feedback:
  - Inconsistency with implementation approach among schools.
  - Some families are considering switching schools to where there is space.

New Sport or Art initiative 2. Minimum length of the program: 8 weeks 3. Grant covers initiatives at K-8 4. Occurs directly after school 5. Dollars for EA support can be included in the applications •

**SD33** Enhancements being made this year to the ASSAI Grant:

1. New Sport or Art Initiative • Schools can apply for EA support for existing programs that may or may not be ASSAI Grant initiatives (for example, Beyond the Bells is already running at middle school) as well as new initiatives (ASSAI or other), that occur directly after school. • Schools can apply for EA support for programs based on Arts, Sports, or social opportunities. • Schools can apply for EA support for a student to participate in Extracurricular sports at elementary or middle school. This is unique to SD33 and a pilot project within our district! Food Council: • Thank you to those who participated in the annual Plant a Row tradition! – 7,000 pounds were harvested on Harvest Day in October, and about 75,000 pounds were harvested over the growing season. Please keep us in mind as you begin to plan your gardens soon, as this year's goal is to bring in 100,000 lbs of produce from the community this year!

- Over the holidays, saw record demands, with over 2k hampers and 5k people served, not
  including other community, church, and toy programs in the city
- Even given the above, through focused efforts, and better coordination this year, feedback shows that most folks were able to be served; thank you for that. · Challenges & Demands – Streams Foundation is seeing a 50% increase in their emergency hamper program, so the need is continuing into the New Year.
- Highest areas of need: Seniors, the working poor, those newer to Canada *DTCM: (Downtown Chilliwack Community Market)* Will be moving to Saturdays this season! This should assist with obtaining more meat/protein vendors. https://chilliwackmarket.com/
  - The market nutrition coupons are in a renewal year, they won't find out until April if they are eligible.
- Approx 100k in fresh foods flows into our community yearly through this program

#### **Early Years**

Planning has continued for the Early Years Fair, which will be on June 4 from 1:00-3:00 pm at the Sardis Library.



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- Child Care Resource & Referral (CCRR) provided an update that adequate childcare spaces throughout the city are available in daycares. What is currently unknown is if they are in the correct locations that families need them to be, as some of them are in concentrated regions. This will continue to be monitored and assessed.
- The Chilliwack School District is working to strengthen its support networks for families and children by partnering with various service providers. They have initiated connections with the Early Years District Principal and childcare in schools, which has led to further collaborations with Sardis Doorway. Through Sardis Doorway, the district is reaching out to new moms who have recently had babies and are struggling to get their older children to school. Additionally, the district is connecting with the Bridge team to support children who are not attending school and to link families with necessary service providers. These efforts aim to ensure that families receive comprehensive support, helping children transition back to regular school attendance.
