Summary

- There were 91 instructional days from September 3, 2024 to January 31, 2025.
- 35.3% of On-Reserve Students were absent 10% or more of the time.
- 20.7% of All Students are absent 10% or more of the time.
- Studies show that students that miss more than 10% of the time may be at risk.

Section 3: ACHIEVEMENT - 2024-2025 Semester 1 Marks

i. Grades K-9 Marks: Extending and Proficient

- Students in Grades K-9 are marked on a four-point Provincial Proficiency Scale.
- The scale uses the terms "Emerging," "Developing," "Proficient," and "Extending" to describe student learning.
- "Extending" is when students show a deep understanding.
- "Proficient" is the goal for all students.
- "Developing" means the student understands some things in an area of learning but still has other areas to work on.
- "Emerging" means the student is beginning to understand something in an area of learning.

Literacy	31.8%	55.4%
Numeracy	39.1%	67.0%



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Summary

- 55.4% of all Students are Proficient or Extending in Literacy.
- 67% of all Students are Proficient or Extending in Numeracy.
