When factoring in the additional courses anticipated to be taken by students in grades 10-12, the projected full-time equivalent enrollment is estimated to match projected enrollment.

The SD33 Summer Learning Program offered a variety of programs for students in and around Chilliwack during the month of July. Our Elementary and Middle School programs ran July 2 - 14, while Secondary courses were offered July 2 - 29.
